

Covers the big picture as well as the stories of the individual officers, enlisted men, civilians and even the founding of the modern military park. Lots of great illustrations and photos both modern and contemporary help round out this book. A Selected Annotated Bibliography helps the reader find material for further reading. Great place to start learning about The Battle of Fredericksburg. Worked great on my Kindle Fire. Highly recommended.
